BRIEF HISTORY:

- ◆ Formed in 1994; a 501(c)3 organization
- ◆ Mission: The CVTA is a nonprofit volunteer based organization working with partners to provide access to public lands through a recreational trail system for present and future generations to enjoy.
- ◆ Partnered with American Land Conservancy to purchase the Fay-Luther Trailhead and deeded to U.S. Forest Service
- ◆ Assisted Douglas County with the 2003 Comprehensive Trails Plan
- ◆ Cooperative agreements or working relationships with U.S. Forest Service, Bureau of Land Management, Douglas County, Alpine County, Tahoe Rim Trail Association, The Nature Conservancy, Nevada Division of State Lands, private land-owners and many more local organizations.

CURRENT PROJECTS:

- ◆ Approximate 22-mile Genoa Foothill Trail System, including Sierra Canyon Trail connector to the Tahoe Rim Trail in west Carson Valley
- ◆ Approximate 18-mile Clear Creek/Jacks Valley Trail System in northwest Carson Valley

COMPLETED PROJECTS:

- ◆ 8.9-mile Fay-Luther and Jobs Peak Ranch Trail System in southwest Carson Valley
- ◆ 3.8-mile Bently-Kirman Tract Trail along the Carson River in north Carson Valley

UPCOMING PROJECTS:

- ◆ Approximate 40 linear and loop trail miles on the east side of the Carson Valley, including the Fish Springs and Johnson/Stephanie Lane areas.
